
Goals and Principles of Child Welfare

The fundamental principles of child welfare include:

- Protect children from harm
- Keep children with their families whenever possible.
- If children must be removed, work on strenthening the family immediately so the child can be returned.
- Place children in the least restrictive, most home-like setting as close to their own home as possible.
- All children will do better in permanent homes.
