

What is Respite Care?

Foster and kinship caregivers for Summit County Children Services (SCCS) are highly valued. We understand that there are time when additional childcare is needed. The respite program is designed to give you up to eight (8) hours of respite care a month for each child placed in your home.

You may utilize the drop-in care during the hours that the contracted centers are open. Examples of reasons when you may utilize this service would be a medial appointment for yourself or another child in the home, time to take care of personal business or simply for a break.

Drop-In Respite Care Purpose

To provide respite care for foster children in the custody of SCCS placed in foster/adoptive/ kinship homes during business hours.

Procedure

- If requested, two vouchers will be provided to caregiver families on a monthly basis via mail for all children in SCCS custody under the age of 12.
- Vouchers can be requested by calling your Foster Home Coordinator, Kinship worker or the child's caseworker.
- Vouchers will be valid for up tot four (4) hours of childcare for each child and may be used on separate days for two 4=hour periods or for one full day of childcare.
- Caregiver will call one of the contracted centers to ensure there is room for the child in the center. See list on the back of this pamphlet.
- Caregiver will drop the child at the center and present the voucher(s) as payment for the childcare service.
- Caregiver must abide by the rules and hours of the contracted center.
- Any fees incurred by the families for not picking children up on time will be the responsibility of the caregiver.
- In order to receive respite vouchers each moth, please contact your Foster Home Coordinator, Kinship worker or the child's caseworker.

A complete description and eligibility for the program can be found in the SCCS respite procedures. Some restrictions apply.
