National Child Abuse Prevention Month

National Child Abuse Prevention
Month was first observed in
1984 to raise the awareness of
the important issue of child
abuse and neglect. Since 1987,
SCCS has observed and
celebrated Child Abuse
Prevention Month (also known
as Child & Family Awareness
Month) annually to educate
people about child abuse and
neglect prevention and to help
build a solid foundation of strong



community support for children and families. On Wednesday, April 12, we painted the county BLUE to kick off Child Abuse Prevention Month and partnered with the Akron Zoo to "Wear Blue at the Akron Zoo" where everyone wearing blue received free admission! The Akron Zoo had over 2,900 guests that day. On Tuesday, April 18th we held a free two-hour training, Close-Up on Protecting our Babies: Practice Safe Sleep, where participants could learn more about sleep-related infant/child deaths and best practices for safe sleep.


In Honor of Reunification Month, Meet Nichole!
